We met in a room in a building close to EDS. Merv had, at Colonel Simons' request, secured a radio. When I walked into the room, Colonel Simons was there with the radio on. He had just come in from the gun range and was eating peanuts -- his lunch. He explained that he needed to get the group on to Iran. He felt that was the only way he would be able to accurately assess the situation. I believe I recall him indicating that the men had starting pulling together as a unit. I know he said "We have done as much here as we can do". He also reemphasized that unless a plan had a 95% chance of success, it would not be undertaken.

23/19 Please describe your last meeting in Iran with Simons, when you gave him the green light.

We talked in the kitchen of a dirty run down apartment where the men had been living. The men were in the other room. We had been through the bribe, also the Shah had left the country, Khomeini was coming in, there was no reason to feel the negotiations climate would improve. There was every reason to believe we were running out of time to accomplish anything. The decision was obvious to both of us. It was not pondered on or debated. The meeting took less than five minutes.

28/28 Date and time of day you called Kissinger. Day and time of his reply.
It is uncertain. We believe I called him on December 30, 1978 and he replied on December 31, 1978.

42/4 Simons' memorial service: names of the men whose lives he had saved, and how.

26/3 What upset Gayden at the Turkish border situation?

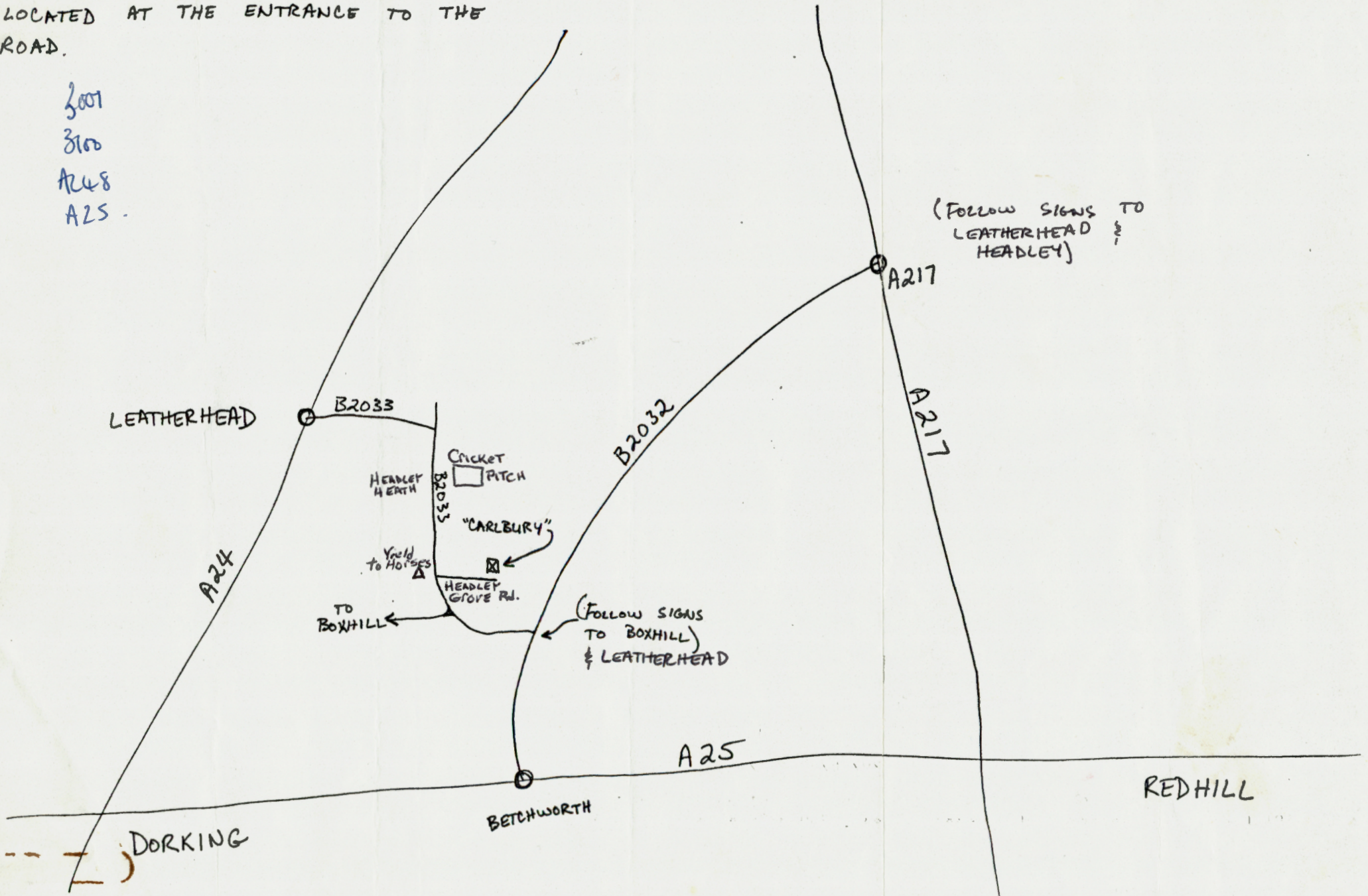
Gayden indicated it was the same as what upset the Colonel. (Answered by Gayden)

AN ADDITIONAL ANECDOTE ...

As we left Tehran on the evacuation flight Saturday morning, I ended up carrying two suitcases -- one was Jay Coburn's and the other belonged to Bill Gaylord.

When Paul and Bill arrived at the hotel after their escape and we advised the underground team, Col. Simons and his men came to the hotel and brought suitcases with clothes for Paul and Bill. Later that evening when Col. Simons ordered the underground team and Paul and Bill to return to the Dvoranchik apartment because of revolutionary activity around the hotel, the suitcases were left behind.

The next morning when the rest of us left, we left our luggage behind as well in order to appear as though we were routinely going to the office as usual. A few days later while we were at Lou Goelz's house, one of our local Iranian employees, ^{Gholam} [REDACTED], was dispatched to the hotel to pay our bills and recover our luggage. We then learned that a few hours after our departure, the revolutionaries had taken over the hotel and generally destroyed our rooms as well as any of our luggage that was locked, as was mine. At the hotel, ^{Gholam} [REDACTED] had gathered up what he could and stuffed it into paper bags and what suitcases could be salvaged. He then took it all to Rich Gallagher's apartment as pre-arranged so he would not be exposed to where we were staying.

Early Friday morning, February 16, Rich Gallagher and I drove to Rich's apartment to recover as much of the personal belongings as we could for the members of the team. Since my suitcases had been destroyed by cutting their sides out, according to ^{Gholam} [REDACTED], I took two suitcases which turned out to be Gaylord's and Coburn's and filled them with what I could find of mine and others belongings.

On Saturday morning, we were at the airport trying to check in for our flight along with about 800 other Americans. In the midst of the check in process, I noticed a luggage tag with Bill Gaylord's name on it on his suitcase. I thought to myself, "Jesus Christ, that's all we need!" and removed the tag. I put it in my pocket intending to discard it at the first opportunity. However, as things turned out, we got through the airport formalities with relative ease, and I decided to keep the tag to give to Bill as a memento.

Later, as we sat on the plane and the authorities were searching the planes for

Paul and Bill, the tag began to burn a hole in my pocket. After the first search of the plane, I went to the bathroom and discarded the tag in the trash.

Still later on the plane, I was very glad I had noticed the tag and removed it. The authorities began searching each piece of luggage to be loaded on the plane and occasionally calling the name of a bag's owner to come to the back of the plane. I thought surely they would have noticed the name tag as being one of the guys they were searching for -- further convincing them that Bill was on the plane and intensifying their search.

After we were safely out, I learned that even a few more minutes delay in our departure would likely have resulted in the State Department ordering our group off the plane so the Iranians could allow the planes to leave in time to be out of Iranian airspace before dark. What would have happened then can only be conjectured upon.
