THE NUMBERS MAN: Episode One - Sheek, Rattle and Roll.

Mrs Munkin eventually learns he's the brother of H.H.

1. Establishing shot: London Hilton or similar - static footage.
2. Hotel suite. HAMEL RAMIA is an Arab at about 40, thoroughly Westernized: Peter English, striped suit, etc - except that he is crazy about milk-and-water & the fifties. He represents a sheik, whom we never will see, who is referred to throughout simply as His Holiness. With him is ~~GEORGE~~ MAKEPIECE, a wonderful minnowman. Makepiece is dressed well, if a little floridly, and speaks with a modulated London accent (which will revert to Cockney in other company). Hauis and Makepiece have just agreed a deal - we don't know what is being bought and sold - and Hauis says that His Holiness won't ratify the terms. Exit Makepiece. To his consternation he turns around to the closed door and whispers: 'Mug!'
3. Titles
4. The flat. Late at night. A dinner party has reached the 'Another brandy?' stage. The guests are PETER and CAROLINE, a quarrelsome couple the same age as Richard & Nutty. Richard is being very charming to Caroline, who is a bit too beautiful. Peter questions Richard about his business. Richard explains that he has acquired something of a reputation for investigating dodgy financial situations. Peter says he wants to recommend Richard to an Arab client. After the guests leave, Nutty accuses Richard of flirting with Caroline. 'I was only being pleasant.' They agree that Peter and Caroline are unspeakable; but, Richard wants Arab business.
5. An unexplained shot of Makepiece firing a gun. 'Very impressive,' he says, and laughs his head off.
6. Richard walks out of his window - and sees a dark limousine drawn up outside.
7. And sees a dark limousine drawn up outside, driven by an Arab, ~~AHMET~~ ABRAM.
8. Mrs Munkin: The car is here to take you to Hamid Hauis.
9. In the other office, Abram is making eyes at an embarrassed Mrs Munkin. Exit Richard and Abram.
10. Hotel suite: enters Richard. Hauis explains: His Holiness wishes to invest in London Housing Ltd, a property company. However, he must be sure that the company is genuinely sound and respectable. Richard agrees to investigate.
11. A shot of Makepiece counting a bundle of banknotes. Full back gradually to reveal great piles of cash.
12. Richard tells Mrs Munkin to get him: balance sheet, check them out at Companies House, and run a credit check.
13. The flat. Richard and Nutty are getting ready to go out. Richard tells her about His Holiness. He is little more than a tribal chieftain with an oil well. He is having trouble with rebels. Richard can't understand why he wants to invest in a company as small as LHL.
14. The nightclub. Enter Richard and Nutty. It is a very tacky joint, with go-go dancers and 'hostesses'. It is run by LHL, Richard explains. While Nutty goes to the bar a hussy tries to pick him up. Nutty decides to do a story on herself.
15. Nutty's office. She proposes the story to NELL REEVEY. "In your own time."
16. The nightclub, daytime. Enter Nutty, dressed to kill. Makepiece gives her a job. There is no salary, just a commission in each bottle of bad champagne you can persuade the punters to buy.
17. The limousine drawn up outside Richard's office
18. He walks out of the window and is pursued. Mrs Munkin buys him a night. Abram is taking her to dinner.
19. Richard enters the nightclub. Nutty: Now you'll have to buy a bottle of champagne. Richard: You were flirting with that guy. Nutty: I was only being pleasant. All part of the job. (Nutty thinks there's more to Makepiece than Reevey claims & she's property.) MORE NUTTY INVESTIGATIONS.

20. Hotel. Richard tells Remy: 'They're earning about double what I would expect from these arms - and I'd like to know how.' So should I, Mr. Middle; so should I.
21. Nutry tortures Peter, a drunken friend of Makepiece. The two have just concluded a deal of some kind. Peter mentions 'the warehouse'. He gets annoyed when Nutry won't go home with him, and says: 'I went to a lot of trouble to get them shysters for your boss.'
22. Outside the club, night. Nutry emerges in leather, climbs on motorcycle, and away.
23. The flat. Enter Nutry in leather. She strips him off to reveal glam does underneath. She tells Richard about the warehouse and the shysters.
24. Office. Property search reveals that the warehouse is owned by one Timothy Silvester, but heavily mortgaged to Makepiece.
25. Richard visits the warehouse.
26. Inside the warehouse, Richard poses as an arms buyer. Makepiece says the guns are sold, really, but he can extract a few from the compartment if the price is right. Richard carefully notes the make and type of gun.
27. Makepiece becomes suspicious of Nutry.
28. Richard asks Mrs Monkton to check out the gun with the War Museum. SA. Her rep: Richard: well?
29. Hotel. Richard tells Remy that LLL are arms dealers. Ah, says Remy, then I shouldn't do business with them. Yes, you will, says Richard: it was the gun you were after all the time. You just used me to check that they were real. Well, I have one more piece of information for you. You've been conned. The guns are double. Oh, they work all right - but you can't buy ammunition for them say more.
30. The nightclub. Makepiece finds Nutry out and sends her packing. He says to a sidekick: 'Give her a good frightening.'
31. Nutry leaves on her motorcycle. The sidekick follows in a car and drives her off the road. She is badly injured.
32. Abram, dressed up in Arab robes, headphones and shades so we're not sure it's him, enters the club and is admitted to Makepiece's office.
33. Richard sees Nutry encased in plaster in a hospital bed.
34. Abram leaves Makepiece's office.
35. Night outside the club: Abram gets into the car & drives off.
36. Richard gets a note, reads it, and burns it.
37. A henchman enters the office & screams. Makepiece is dead.
38. Richard's note reads: Revenge has been done.
